Pic O De Crop finals showdown

JUDGEMENT DAY IS HERE for the 18 finalists who will be competing to become Barbados' calypso

They will face off during the Courtesy Pic O De Crop competition at the Richard Stoute
Amphitheatre at the National Botanical Gardens, Waterford, St Michael.

In this year's competition are both former monarchs and young calypsonians who have one

shot to win the crown. Reigning monarch Adrian AC Clarke will be hoping to reclaim the title and add a fourth under his belt. **iWeb** will be looking to capture his fifth title while **Classic** is pushing for a third title. **Mr Blood** and **Quon** will both be aiming for a second crown.

The line-up also includes Sir Ruel, who will be hoping to go all the way. Father and son Billboard

and Dynamo are also part of the line-up.

De Announcer, Biggie Irie, Chrystal, Donella and Colin Spencer, who have been to the Finals before, are also competing.

Raanan, Teri, Doyenne, Queen Kareen and

Jamal Slocombe are also vying for the crown.
While speaking on CBC TV 8, which will televise the competition live, Minister in the Prime Minister's Office Senator Dr Shantal Munro-Knight encouraged the public to support the event.

She dismissed the notion that calypso is dying.

"People always say that the calypso art form, listening to social commentary, is dying, and I think this year we at the National Cultural Foundation have invested a lot working with our Junior Monarchs as well and giving assistance to the tents and the calypsonians, so I think this year can be a defining one," she said.

the Botanical Gardens, all hands were on deck as preparations for the competition continued. The stage crew was seen lifting tables and chairs. Musicians from the band were preparing to rehearse and several other officials were working assiduously

to ensure the area was ready.

Avoid driving on drain covers, says MTW

THE MINISTRY of Transport and Works (MTW) is advising motorists to avoid driving or parking on temporary drain covers installed along Princess Alice Highway and Harbour Road in Bridgetown.

The drains have been temporarily covered with plywood sheets as a safety measure to prevent injury to revellers who will be participating in the Foreday Morning Jam and Flow Grand Kadooment events.

The plywood sheets are unable to support vehicle loads and may break or become damaged due to the weight. This poses a risk to pedestrians and drivers. To ensure that safety is a priority, people should not drive or park on the plywood drain covers.

People are also reminded that parking on

sidewalks is prohibited under the Road Traffic Act Cap. 295 and may result in the Barbados Police Service issuing tickets to offenders.

MTW encourages everyone to enjoy the festivities, but to prioritise safety first while on the roads during the last lap of Crop Over.

Cop: Make wise decisions when parking

THE BARBADOS POLICE SERVICE'S crime prevention officer Roger Babb is urging motorists to make wise decisions when parking, so as to avoid theft of or from their vehicles.

"Utilise designated parking areas and park in safe, well-lit areas where possible," Inspector Babb said.

Some of the tips he shared with motorists are: · Close and lock all windows and doors

when you park. Do not leave the key in your vehicle; secure it.

 Never leave your vehicle engine turned on and the vehicle unattended:

 Do not leave valuables in your vehicle, especially if they can be seen from the

outside.
• Utilise steering wheel locks and other locking devices if you have them.

· Consider installing a security alarm system or tracking device in your vehicle. If your vehicle is stolen, immediately call the police at 211. Provide the year, make, colour, registration, engine, and chassis numbers, and inform your insurance company within 24 hours.

Additionally, Babb urged the public to protect themselves and their personal property to minimise the risk of being robbed. The safety tips he shared are:

• Know your surroundings.

 Pay attention to the people around you and

watch for any suspicious behaviour.

· Go to a busy area if you suspect you are being followed.

• Stay in well-lit areas as much as possible. Stay with the crowd - there is safety in

numbers. · Avoid wearing expensive jewellery, as that action will draw

attention to you. Do not display a lot of money when purchasing items.

 Have your car keys in hand when walking to your vehicle, and immediately lock the doors on entering it.
• If confronted by an

assailant carrying a weapon, do not resist. If attacked, stay calm, evaluate options, and keep assessing the

situation as it unfolds. Observe the attacker carefully for future identification purposes. Call 211 and report the incident to the police. (BGIS)
